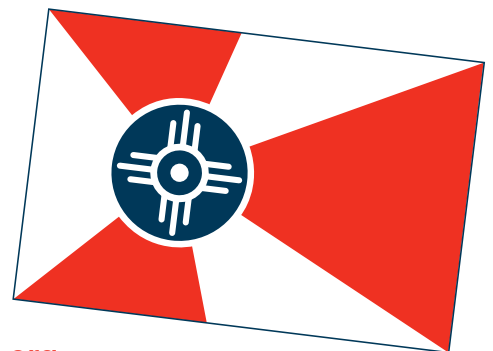

HISTORY

Wichita's official city flag was designed by local artist Cecil McAlister in a 1937 city flag contest and accepted by proclamation on Flag Day that same year.

- The red and white rays symbolize the path of freedom to come and go as one pleases.
- The blue disc represents happiness and contentment.
- The white Native American Hogan symbol signifies "permanent home."
